### Increasing high school graduation Rates for AI/AN students


The Title VI Indian Education Program (circa 1972) supports the efforts of school districts, Tribes, AI/AN organizations, postsecondary institutions, and other entities to meet the unique educational and culturally related academic needs of AI/AN students. Because the Title VI program is a formula-based grant, it is imperative that we accurately identify our AIAN students and bridge them to services like this.

Yet, California is home to the highest population of AI/AN people in the nation with over 110 federally recognized Tribes and over 100 Tribal lands.<sup>4</sup>

### Increase Title VI funding for AI/AN students



#### FROM 2014 TO 2016, CA TITLE VI PROGRAMS:

- decreased from 94 programs to 92 programs
- decreased enrollment 27, 957 to 22,483
- decreased funding \$5.4 million to \$4.5 million



#### **COLLEGE READINESS**

of AIAN students graduated meeting the UC/CSU requirements (compared to the statewide total 49.9%).<sup>1</sup>



#### **COLLEGE ENROLLMENT**

of AIAN students (18-24 years old) were enrolled for college in 2017.<sup>3</sup>
